

## **Focus on Nonprofits**

**Outlook** The nonprofit sector employed 12.3 million people in 2016, growing nearly 17% from 2007 to 20016. (John Hopkins University – Center for Civil Society Studies). Employment of social and community service managers is projected to grow 18% from 2016 to 2026, much faster than the average for all occupations. (Bureau of Labor Statistics, Occupational Outlook Handbook, 2019)

**Injuries** Hospital workers experience 129.8 injuries or illness per 100,000 workers, significantly higher than the overall rate for private industry (89.4). Experience for the education services (50.9) and social assistance industries (88.4) is lower. (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2017)

**Workforce** Most nonprofit jobs are in health care (hospitals, health clinics and nursing homes), education (including private schools) and social assistance. (John Hopkins University – Center for Civil Society Studies).

Three: Workplace Violence

Health care and social services workers are at a greater risk of being

assaulted.

The transfer and storage of patient data creates formidable patient privacy

issues.

Five: Changing Regulatory/Legislative/Reimbursement Environment

Uncertainty arising from federal and local regulations and ambiguity

concerning health care affects planning and budgeting.
